Why Psalm 139:14

How Boxbob is an overly enthusiastic, well-meaning, goofy fellow and Boxsue is his

patient sidekick. Ham up the puns. Can be played by adults, but teens would

also be very effective.

Time Approximately 3 minutes

Boxbob enters whistling. Boxsue comes in a few seconds later.

Boxsue: Hey, Boxbob, why are you so happy?

Boxbob: What makes you think I'm happy?

Boxsue: You were whistling.

Boxbob: Oh. Yeah. It's because I was thinking about something wonderful.

Boxsue: What?

Boxbob: Me.

Boxsue: You are kind of special, but it's really not polite to go around telling

people.

Boxbob: I'm not bragging. My Sunday School teacher said I was wonderfully

made.

Boxsue: And you think that means you're wonderful?

Boxbob: Yep.

Boxsue: I don't think that's exactly what your teacher meant.

Boxbob: Are you saying I'm NOT wonderful?

Boxsue: No.

Boxbob: So, you're saying I am wonderful.

Boxsue: No.

Boxbob: Make up your mind.

Boxsue: Boxbob, I'm saying you are wonderfully made.

Boxbob: Oh. (Beat) What's the difference?

Boxsue: God made your body and it's wonderful.

Boxbob: You just said I'm wonderful.

Boxsue: I said you're wonderfully made. By God. If you want to be wonderful,

then you need to do wonderful things.

Boxbob: (thinks for a second) I do.

Boxsue: Like what?

Boxbob: I didn't pick on my sister this morning.

Boxsue: Now we're getting somewhere. That's wonderful. I bet that made her

happy.

Boxbob: Maybe. It's hard to tell. She was at Grammy's house.

Boxsue: You didn't pick on your sister because she wasn't there?

Boxbob: Yeah. It's so much easier when she's not around.

Boxsue: (sighs) Boxbob, I give up.

Boxbob: That's wonderful...Hey, see? We're both wonderful.

Boxsue: Wonderfully made.

Boxbob: That's what I said.

Boxsue: (exasperated) You know what? When I'm around you, I realize how

wonderful it is that God loves us just the way we are.

Boxbob: So, you're saying that being around me helps you remember that God

loves us?

Boxsue: Yes.

Boxbob: There, I did it.
